GRANTS COORDINATOR: Half-time position, 12 month. Position could be combined with other positions at the school into a full-time position.

- Bachelor's degree in an education related field, or with a concentration in finance or previous experience in grants financial management required.
- Functional proficiency in Ojibwe required.
- Experience in an Indigenous language immersion setting and instructional proficiency in Ojibwe Preferred.
- Assist the School Director in the performance of all duties at the administrative level regarding funded grants and grant proposals; maintain and monitor financial management and bookkeeping, coordinate all grant processes to ensure compliance and funding guidelines.
