## Pardon & Forgiveness Program

What is it? Pardon and Forgiveness is a formal process in which Tribal and Non-Tribal members may be granted pardons (for criminal convictions) or forgiveness for acts that render them ineligible for certain Tribal benefits such as employment, certifications, housing and various permits. Pardon and forgiveness will not overrule certain laws (i.e. felons being allowed to possess firearms and laws regarding Foster care licensure).

Completed applications must be submitted to the Lac Courte Oreilles Tribal ("LCO") Administration Human Resources Director.
