POSITION: CULTURE/OJIBWEMOWIN TEACHER

LOCATION: LAC COURTE OREILLES OJIBWE SCHOOL

DURATION: 10 MONTH (SCHOOL YEAR)

DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES:

- Directly responsible to the K-12 Principal.
- Development of curriculum/lesson plans for the Ojibwe culture component of the school.
- Responsible for the development and documentation of necessary reports and input into Infinite Campus: attendance, grade reports, quarterly reports, class scheduling, deficiency reports, etc.
- Assist classroom teachers with the incorporation of Ojibwe culture into the regular classroom curriculum.
- Work on school cultural events, such as feast, ceremonies, powwows, staff and student cultural/language workshops, guest presentations and curriculum.
- Meets with parents, in conjunction with the Principal and Counselor regarding student deficiency reports, disciplinary measures, and attendance.
- Assist in monitoring students in the morning, noon, between classes and after school.
- Attend staff meetings.
- Assists in school events such as, but not limited to, art, music programs, school feasts and ceremonies, Powwows, student awards programs, assemblies and graduations.
- Provide students, staff, and families with the knowledge and understanding of Anishinaabe seasonal and cultural activities.
- Be prepared to endure all weather conditions in order to assist students and staff in seasonal and cultural activities.
- Continue learning and developing skill assets needed to grow skills and knowledge in cultural and seasonal activities.

QUALIFICATIONS:

- A minimum of a high school diploma or GED. Must work toward Wisconsin Language/History/Culture licensure 925, 926.
- Practicing and working knowledge and experience in Ojibwe culture.
- Prior successful classroom experience teaching American Indian children.
- Must be supportive of philosophy, concept, policy and procedures of the LCO Ojibwe School.
- Native American preference in employment.
